Background Information

For students graduating in 2023 and beyond, **five** pathways exist for meeting state high school graduation requirements:

- 1. Keystone Proficiency
- 2. Keystone Composite Score

 (4452, at least 1 proficient or advanced score; no below basic
- score, no waivers)
- 3. Career and Technical Education (CTE) Concentrator
- 4. Alternative Assessment
- 5. Evidence-Based



Keystone Proficiency PATHWAY

Meets proficiency or advanced on each of the Keystone Exams

- · Algebra I
- · Biology
- Literature

Keystone Composite PATHWAY

Demonstrate proficiency by earning a satisfactory composite score on the Algebra I, Literature, and Biology Keystone Exams of 4452

Must achieve at least a proficient score on one of the three exams and no less than a basic score on the remaining two

PATHWAY

- 1. Successful completion of Keystone course
- 2. AND the attainment of one of the following:
 - a. An industry-based competency certification
 - b. Demonstration of a high likelihood of
- 1. Successful completion of Keystone course
- 2. \boldsymbol{AND} the attainment of \boldsymbol{one} of the following:
 - a. Established score on an approved alternate assessment (SAT, PSAT, ACT, ASVAB, AP, IB)
 - b. Successful completion of a concurrent course

- success on an approved industrybased competency assessment
- c. Readiness for continued meaningful engagement in the CTE concentrator's program of study
- Successful completion of a pre-apprenticeship program
- d. Accepted in an accredited 4-year nonprofit institution of higher education and have evidence of the ability to enroll in college-level coursework

Evidence Based PATHWAY

- Successful completion of Keystone course
- 2. Three pieces of evidence consistent with the student's goals and career plans

Other PATHWAY

- Graduation based on IEP team decisions based upon academic goals
- 2. Superintendent's waiver for students with extenuating circumstances (5%)



Pathway #1 Example: Keystone Proficiency

Jerry's Keystone Exam Scores:

- Keystone Algebra I: 1562 Advanced
- Keystone Biology: 1502 Proficient
- Keystone English Literature: 1580 Proficient

Katy's Keystone Exam Scores:

- Keystone Algebra I: 1540 Proficient
- Keystone Biology: Waiver, student was enrolled in a trigger class during the 2019-2020 school year; passed course, exempt from Keystone exam (counted as proficient)
- Keystone English Literature: 1571 Proficient

Pathway #2 Example: Keystone Composite (4452)

*At least one Proficient score, no Below Basic scores allowed

*No waiver of Keystone Exam allowed

Nick's Keystone Exam Scores: 4554

- Keystone Algebra I: 1505 Proficient
- Keystone Biology: 1478 Basic
- Keystone English Literature: 1571 Proficient

Jessica's Keystone Exam Scores: 4477

- Keystone Algebra I: 1481 Basic
- Keystone Biology: 1460 Basic
- Keystone English Literature: 1536 Proficient

CTE Concentrator, Alternative Assessment, and Evidence Based Pathways

Meet local grade-based requirements for Keystone content in which student is **less than Proficient**

Satisfy additional requirements from ONE of the following...

Career & Technical Education

•1 Piece of Evidence

Alternative Assessment

•1 Piece of Evidence

Evidence Based

• 3 Pieces of Evidence

consistent w/student goals

ONE or more from the first seven No more than TWO from the last five

Pathway #3 Example: Career & Technical Education

Students must pass the content of the Keystone Trigger Course

*One Piece of Evidence:

- Industry-based competency certification (ex. OSHA)
- Likelihood of industry-based competency assessment success
- Readiness for continued engagement in Career and Technical Education (CTE) Concentrator program of study

Tracy, Student Example:

- Passed Algebra I course, Biology course and English Lit course
- Attends BCTC for Culinary Arts
- Successfully completed OSHA certification
- Competency Based Certifications
- Internships

Pathway #4 Example: Alternative Assessment

*One Piece of Evidence (for ALL Keystone Exams not Proficient; linked to content)

Jacob, Student Example: Keystone Exams and Composite Scores-No Proficiency

- Keystone Algebra I: 1458 Below Basic
- Keystone Biology: 1453 Below Basic
- Keystone English Literature: 1401 Below Basic (Eliminates Pathways #1 & #2)
- Student does not attend BCTC or participate in an internship program (Eliminates Pathway #3)
- Scored an 890 on his PSATs; (970); did not take the SAT (1010)
- Student is not enrolled in any AP courses
- Student did not take the ASVAB (31), ACT (21) or ACT WorkKeys (Gold Level)

Pathway #4 Example: Would Jacob Satisfy Criteria of Alternative Assessment Pathway?

Only possible choices for Jacob to satisfy his Graduation Requirements utilizing Pathway #4-Alternative Assessments are the following:

- Successful completion of concurrent course(s) related to each Keystone content area in which less than Proficient; (satisfied if he attends either RACC or Albright and completes a course related to the non-proficient Keystone content)
- Successful completion of an industry recognized credential or pre-apprenticeship program; (satisfied if he attends the new Diversified Occupations BCTC Program)
- Acceptance into 4 year Institution of Higher Education (IHE) for college-level coursework

Pathway #5 Example: Can Jacob Satisfy Requirements for Evidenced-Based Pathway?

*Earns three Pieces of Evidence across the two different sub-categories

Student Example, Jacob can have **one or more** of the following (Category A):

- ACT WorkKeys (Silver Level)
- Successful completion of a concurrent or post-secondary course (he attends RACC or Albright and successfully completes any content course)
- Acceptance into an other-than-4-year Institution of Higher Education for college level coursework (Trade School or a 2-year Junior /Community College, etc.)

Pathway #5 Example: Evidenced Based Pathway

Jacob can have **no more than two** of the following (Category B):

- Attainment of Proficiency or Advanced on any Keystone Exam (no specific content)
- Successful completion of a Service-Learning Project (designed by WASD)
- Letter guaranteeing full-time employment or military enlistment
- Completion of an internship, externship, or cooperative education program (successful completion of the new Diversified Occupations BCTC Program)
- Compliance with NCAA Division II academic requirements

*This is where most of our students will satisfy the ACT 158 requirements; for each pathway students must successfully pass the content related to Keystone trigger course(s)

Additional Ways to Satisfy Graduation Requirements

- IEP Goals, no limit or percentage restrictions
- Superintendent Waivers
 - Cannot be more than 5% of the Graduating Class enrollment
 - Will be reserved for new students who transfer into Wyomissing Area as seniors, especially from out of state; homebound and residential students

** Includes all BOL Students and Students who attend Off-Campus (PIMS Reporting)

What's New for Next School Year?

- Addition of the ASVAB AFQT and the ACT WorkKeys Assessments to the assessment calendar for specific students; 11th graders to re-take the PSATs
- Remediation must be offered for all students who retake a Keystone Exam
- Possibly offer Additional Certifications such as Google & Microsoft Certifications
 (gr. 9-12)
- Provide opportunities for Service Learning Projects (10 hours of service)
