Reduction of Graduation Credit Requirements – The Why

- The responsibility of the K-12 school system goes beyond preparing students to be proficient academically. We need to create a system that benefits all of our students, preparing them for life after high school.
- This reduction adds flexibility to students' schedules so they are more free to pursue areas of interest. These options include:
 - Courses on our campus or in collaboration with local school districts
 - Internships
 - Employment opportunities
 - College credit-bearing courses
 - Research/authentic learning opportunities
- Recognizes the challenges of transient students who have been in systems with less credit requirements in their transition to WASD.

Reduction of Graduation Credit Requirements – The Why

- Build on current partnerships with BCTC and Morgan Corporation
 - New Diversified Occupations Program
- Act 158 Requirements beginning with Class of 2023
- Provides opportunities for WASD teachers to expand student-desired elective courses:
 - PE – Student input into course development
 - New courses will include:
 - Mindfulness and Yoga Practices (to meet increased mental health needs)
 - Team Games
 - Backyard/Recreation Games
 - Net Games

Process of Project- How We Got Here

- 2020 – 2021 – Discussions related to Dual Enrollment with local universities
- Summer/Fall 2021 – WASD District Administration and High School Administration Brainstorming Discussions
- October 2021 – Met with local school district who has recently undergone similar process
- October 2021 – WASD Administrative Planning
- November 2021 – Presentation during WASD Curriculum Committee meeting
- December 2021 – Meeting with JSHS Department Chairs to discuss Credit Reduction options and Dual Enrollment opportunities
- January 2022 – Collaboration with PE Department to create options that promote life-long fitness and are of high-interest to students

- English
 - Renamed 8th grade writing courses and revised course descriptions
- Computer Science
 - Developed New course Honors STEM Robotics III - Renamed Introduction to Engineering course to Essentials of Engineering
- Art
 - Eliminated Public Art Workshop
