Upon a motion by Mrs. Bamberger, second by Mr. Painter, the Board approved the following Finance/Facilities item.

During discussion several Board members expressed their concern with the frequency, amount, and ability to budget for these types of settlements. Mrs. Vicente explained that settlements are made based on the advice of legal counsel and are considered on a case-by-case basis. Board members questioned what services the District could provide to avoid getting to the

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point of needing a settlement. Mrs. Vicente said since each case has different circumstances it would be inappropriate to generalize and there is no one-size-fits-all solution. Mrs. Butera indicated that all school districts statewide are facing this problem. Mrs. Helm requested a two-year tally of these settlements. Mrs. Bamberger also requested that the tally include agreements to provide services in outside placements.
